1. CofC members may order a CofC Recruiter Pin when a CofC member has assisted in recruiting three new members.
2. The Chapter Director must maintain a record of the number of members assisted by each member on the Member for Member Form. Projects and Goals:

I. Encourage all Children of the Confederacy to study the catechism. This includes the sale of catechisms. One way we can effectively uphold the ideals of this organization is to know the ins and outs of the War Between the States: who was important, what was important. The catechism has compiled almost everything you need to know about the War Between the States and important facts about the Children of the Confederacy and its founders. By learning the catechism, you are preparing yourself for the questions that you will be asked whenever you are talking about the War Between the States, whether it be with a friend, or at an educational event. One way I will promote this is to write about specific catechism questions in each of my Courier articles.

II. Promote scholarships. I will encourage members to apply and donate to the five scholarships offered by the Children of the Confederacy and United Daughters of the Confederacy. They are: Winnie Davis Scholarship Fund

Wittichen-Wilcox-Dickens Scholarship

Silver Jubilee Scholarship Fund

Miller-Coulter Scholarship Fund

Golden Anniversary Scholarship Fund

By donating to these scholarships, as well as to division scholarships, you help further the education of a descendant of a Confederate Veteran. The applicants of these scholarships have immersed themselves in the Second War for Independence through the Children of the Confederacy, it has reshaped their views on many things, such as history and politics. Through college these views will come out to shape their future.

III. Conduct an essay contest on the President General's project: Looking Back and Remembering 150 Years. This is one way you can get involved this year. The contest rules are:

1. The contestants must write about the Sesquicentennial. This ranges from things that were happening 150 years ago, how the war has been remembered up until now, or how people are commemorating the 150th anniversary of the War Between the States, and beyond.

2. There are three contest divisions. Each division will be judged separately, with one contestant from each division being named winner. The first division is ages 15-18, the second division is ages 10-14, the third division is ages 9 and under.
3. The contestants are limited to five typed pages or less.
4. The contestants must include a title to their essay, their name, mailing address, e-mail address, age, and grade.
5. Each contestant may submit as many essays as they want so long as they are different from each other.
6. The contestants are not limited to how they present their essay. The contestants may write short stories of historical fiction or in any other form of writing {for example: poetry, research paper, newspaper article, etc....}
7. The contestant's work must be an original document.
8. The contestants must submit their work to the following e-mail address:

9. The deadline is April 1st, 2012.
10. The winning essayists will be notified, and their essays will be printed in the final issue of the Courier in June, and will receive an award at the General Convention in 2012.

New Scholarships awards are available only to current ACTIVE MEMBERS of the Children of the Confederacy.
Funds may vary, see current CofC General Minute Book for more information.

RULES GOVERNING SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

TENURE: General CofC Scholarships shall be automatically renewed provided a request for re-awarding is submitted with a copy of transcript documenting a grade point average of 3.0 or above. Scholarship applications must be sent to the Director General by June 1st. Division deadline is May 1st.

CANDIDATES: Each Division and Chapter in a state where there is no Division may present more than one candidate for the scholarships.

QUALIFICATIONS: All applicants:

1. Must have an active record in the Children of the Confederacy.
2. Be endorsed by the Chapter Director and the Division Director, Children of the Confederacy.
3. Must make application upon the General Organization's official form.
4. Shall complete the application form and submit all information requested.
5. Application shall be submitted no later than June 1 to Director General and by May 1 to the Division or Chapter Where No Division.
6. Application and attachments must be submitted in triplicate.
7. Must currently have and maintain a 3.0 overall GPA.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS:

In addition to information on the application the following LETTERS, RECORDS and ENDORSEMENTS are to be furnished by the student (3 copies of each required):

1. Endorsement from the Chapter Director and the Division Director must be obtained. These endorsements confirm the applicant's activities in the CofC as stated in the scholarship application.
2. Two letters of recommendation shall be submitted with an application, one from a school official and one from a minister or public official who knows the applicant.
3. Official transcript of grades of the previous year or session from the school attended, including PSAT, ACT, or SAT scores if available.
4. A resume written in essay form by the applicant outlining his/her activities and contributions to the Children of the Confederacy. (Essay should be 500 words but no more than 750 words.)

5. The applicant must furnish this additional information.
 - (a) The name and address of the College or University to be attended.
 - (b) Applicant must be prepared to pass the entrance examination of the prospective College. For other information the applicant should write to the college for a catalog before applying for the scholarship.

GENERAL INFORMATION AND REGULATIONS

The scholarship is transferable to another college or university and may be used at any institution approved by the Education Committee.

College students studying nursing in the university or college awarding a degree in Nursing education will be given the same consideration as students working for degrees in other fields.

Application blanks completed in triplicate for the scholarship listed must be submitted to the Division Director prior to May 1st of each year. The Division Director must forward the applications to the Director General no later than June 1st.

All checks for the scholarship will be sent to the recipient and made payable to the College or University in two equal payments, the first in August, and the second following receipt of the recipients first semester grades.

A student leaving college shall forfeit the scholarship, and the college will return the balance in the student's account to the Children of the Confederacy.

The recipient must send a copy of his/her grades to the President General and the Director General at the end of each semester or quarter. In the event the grades are not received, the scholarship shall be forfeited for the next semester or quarter.

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION FOR ALL DIVISION DIRECTORS

A copy of the Education Circular will be sent to each applicant with a request that all rules and all matters of information be carefully noted and given attention as required.

Division Directors must send all applications for scholarships with required endorsements to the Director General, Children of the Confederacy, before June 1st of each year.

The Director General will check all applications to confirm that all required documents are enclosed. She, in turn, will forward to members of the scholarship committee for judging. The scholarships will be awarded at the Children of the Confederacy General Convention in July of each year.

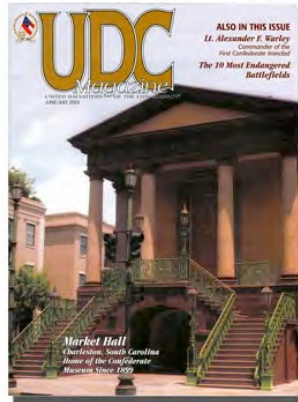
